WELCOME TO THE ANNUAL MONTH OF FELLOWSHIP (Sometimes Known As Flea Market Preparation)

On August 27—the last Sunday in August—downtown Niles hosts a large antique fair. On that day, downtown Niles Boulevard is closed to traffic, antique and food booths are set up, and hordes of bargain-hunters descend on the town, providing buyers for our own flea market and largest fundraiser of the year, right in our own Fellowship Hall. Between selling our cast-off treasures and renting parking spaces in our lot, last year we raised \$9,000.



To prepare for the sale, our congregation and friends clean closets, garages, and storage units and donate used but good, working items to the church. These wonderful treasures are sorted, priced, displayed, and sold throughout the month of August. This gives everyone a good chance to find some great bargains before the actual flea market takes place.



Starting Monday, July 24, unwanted treasure may be brought to the Fellowship Hall on Sundays, weekdays from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., whenever office staff is in the church (see the schedule on page 5), or by appointment: call Alta Jo Adamson, The Flea Wrangler, at (510) 713-1333, and she will arrange to open the church.

Here are some suggestions for donations: tools, books, toys, games (with all

the pieces), jewelry, hats, purses, musical instruments, china, glassware, antiques, tools, collectables, knick-knacks, holiday decorations, linens, blankets, working small appliances, patio accessories, office supplies, children's small furniture, trunks, shoes, chairs, desks, and other small furniture, exercise equipment, sporting goods, and more! Please DO NOT bring: clothing, sofas and other large, heavy, furniture; large drapery rods, sinks, toilets, and soiled, broken, or non-working items.

Where is the fellowship we're talking about? Why, it's every day in August! We need weekday volunteers for all aspects of the sale—sorting, pricing, and selling. We can also use volunteers with trucks or vans to help with hauling items to the church.

The Saturday and Sunday of the Flea Market weekend are staffed by church volunteers in two-hour shifts throughout the day. These hours are especially important to fill. Generally speaking, the whole congregation rolls up its sleeves and pitches in, and it is actually loads of fun.

Jeff's Jottings

You always give me something to brag about.

I'm writing this in the days following the UCC Conference's Annual Gathering. From Thursday to Sunday, Pastor Brenda, Michele McConville, Val Parker, Joy Barnitz, and I got to hang out with people from United Church of Christ congregations all across Northern California and Nevada. We met for worship and workshops and business, to hear reports and to share stories, to eat together and to sing together.

I have enough history in the Conference to have friends who live in various corners and time and again they would ask me, "How are things going at Niles Discovery Church?" And time and again I would tell them how wonderful I think our congregation is and how blessed I feel to be pastoring here.

One of the themes that came up several times was how generous our congregation is and what a big heart our congregation has. They might ask me for examples and I would point out how quickly we raised the money needed for our solar panel system, or how quickly we topped off the needed money for the organ, or how in just one Sunday (without any pre-publicity) we raised enough money to cover the purchase of almost all the



children's picture books for our Sunday School classes.

And then there are the special offerings we receive each month. Like you, I pick and choose which of the special offerings will get my support; there are some that I am more passionate about than the others. Still, month after month, we as a community give hundreds of dollars in special giving.

On top of that, our Treasurer Beth Rasler reports that people are keeping up with their pledges to the General Fund, and giving from people who did not make a pledge is more than we budgeted for. Pastor Brenda and I had every intention of writing a thank you note to each of you who made a pledge last fall to financially support the ministry of our congregation in 2017. Neither of us have gotten to our portion of the list because our church has such a big heart.

On Sunday morning, Pastor Brenda and I were sitting at a table together and we were asked who was preaching (this was June 18). We said that our church is so awesome, we don't need to be there for worship to happen, and then we explained how we are moving forward on our Strategic Plan and the preaching was being

done by five champions of potential new service projects to help us discern which are going to get the congregation's focus this year. I think I made some crack about how our church is so caring that it was going to be difficult to make a decision. It turns out, that wasn't a joke.

At the Cabinet meeting on June 19, we discussed the results of the post-worship planning meetings. The number of people at each meeting was pretty even. It wasn't obvious that any one project just shouldn't get our focus this year. So, in keeping with the timeline adopted when the Strategic Plan was chosen, We will be moving ahead with all five projects, although three of them need more development at this time (see "Cabinet Approves Strategic Plan Projects" on page 3).

We are a generous, loving congregation that, following the example of Jesus, welcomes all people, grows in our relationship with God and each other, and serves our neighbors near and far. And that's why it's easy to brag about you.

CABINET APPROVES STRATEGIC PLAN PROJECTS

During our worship service on July 18, the congregation heard from the champions of our five Goal One projects, and then attended meetings after worship to learn more information about the five project plans. Although overall worship attendance was smaller than usual, attendance at the meetings after worship was enthusiastic, and each meeting had a healthy number of people attending.

In its meeting on Monday, June 19, the Cabinet carefully considered all the options for moving forward, and decided that two of the projects were more “shovel-ready,” and could begin immediately, while the other three projects—which all had significant backing from the congregation—needed more planning and organizing before moving forward. In other words, we will move forward with all five of the finalist projects, but three will begin later in the program year, when they are more developed. In particular, the Cabinet wants all the projects to specify how they will be hands-on, multigenerational, and multicultural.

The projects we will proceed with immediately are the Mobile Food Van and the Habitat for Humanity housing project in central Fremont. The other three projects—supporting St. James School in Kenya, the Homeless Supplies ministry, and the Anti-Racism/Interfaith project—will be started when the champions and their project teams have more thoroughly fleshed out the project plans.

WE ARE ONE RALLY/VIGIL FOCUSES ON UNITY



School Supplies, ALREADY!

Once again, the Ministry of Christian Education will collect school supplies to be distributed by staff at the Family Resource Center (FRC) in Fremont.

The FRC is a collection of co-located social services agencies that serve the Tri-City area. Most agencies serve children and youth, directly or indirectly. The items sought this year are the same as previously: backpacks (for kids under 12 and for high school students) and lunch boxes (non-gender specific, and no gang colors—red/blue). General school supplies are also needed.

Last year the congregation gave very generously: about 40 backpacks, 25 lunch boxes and many bags of school supplies. It was much appreciated by both the FRC staff and the families they serve.

School starts before Labor Day this year, so we will start collecting earlier than usual. Near the end of July, look for donation boxes in the office and inside the west (main) church entrance.

SPECIAL OFFERINGS

The July Special Offering will go to replenish the Pastors' Discretionary Fund. This money is used by our Pastors to help out

families in emergencies. During the past year, our Pastors have been able to help church families keep rent paid, phones connected, prescriptions filled, and lights on thanks to your generosity. They've even helped pay for a cremation.

This offering will be officially received on Sunday, July 9. As with all our special offerings, you are welcome to give at any time (always make checks payable to

SECOND SATURDAY DOCUMENTARY SERIES

CIVIL RIGHTS PIONEER'S CONTINUING FIGHT HIGHLIGHTED IN DOCUMENTARY

John Lewis – Get in the Way chronicles more than a half century of one man's non-violent fight for civil rights. The 2017 film will be shown July 8 at 1:30 p.m. as part of the free Second Saturday Documentary Series at Niles Discovery Church.

Congressman Lewis, D-GA, has been at the center of civil rights history since 1960 when he was arrested as a 20 year-old participant in the Nashville Lunch Counter Protest. He was a leader of the Freedom Riders and the youngest speaker during the 1963 March on Washington where the Reverend Martin Luther King told the crowd, "I have a dream." In 1965, Lewis led the Bloody Sunday March in Selma, Alabama, where he and many others were beaten by police and television cameras carried the cruelty into American living rooms.

Using never-before seen interviews with Lewis and other civil rights activists recorded over the course of the last 20 years, filmmaker Kathleen Dowdy paints a picture of a man still striving to speak truth to power – now as a Capitol Hill insider.

There will be a moderated discussion following the screening.

WHAT'S "SPIRITUAL DIRECTION GROUP A"?

If you read our church calendar (the second to last page of each edition of The Bell) really carefully, you might have noticed that there's a group that meets on the third Wednesday of the month called "Spiritual Direction Group A" and you may have wondered what it is. Here's an attempt to describe it.

As the name implies, it's a group of people who are doing something spiritual. That "something" includes praying together in silence, paying attention to how God seems to be active or absent from our lives, and talking about our relationship with God as



we walk through our lives. It's not a therapy group, though it is supportive. It's not a meditation group, though we spend time in contemplation. It's led by Pastor Jeff most weeks, but sometimes a member of the group leads it.

It's called "Group A" because there is a hope that other small groups of people might want to form such a group. Both Pastor Jeff and Pastor Brenda have training as Spiritual Directors and are both open to helping additional groups form. If you're interested, speak to either of them.
