



## Jeff's Jottings



*"The church must be reminded that it is not the master or the servant of the state, but rather the conscience of the*

*state. It must be the guide and the critic of the state, and never its tool. If the church does not recapture its prophetic zeal, it will become an irrelevant social club without moral or spiritual authority."*

50 years ago last December, the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., issued a public call for a "Poor People's Campaign." King recognized the triple threats to democracy in the United States from racism, militarism, and poverty. He argued that the three overlapped and needed to be addressed together. He argued that they needed to be addressed as moral issues, and the way to do this was with a Poor People's Campaign. Yes, this moral approach would include political action and solutions; it could not do otherwise. But because these triplets posed a moral threat, they needed to be address morally.

I have argued that the three threats King identified still threaten democracy and morality in the United States, and that they are joined by sexism and environmental degradation. In fact, I have argued that human-caused climate change

is the most important moral issue of our day. It is time for a new Poor People's Campaign, and two prominent faith leaders – the Rev. Liz Theoharis and the Rev. Dr. William J. Barber, II – have issued such a call. They are calling this the "Poor People's Campaign: A National Call to Moral Revival."

The ground work for the campaign has already begun. Training sessions are being held across the country. This spring, thousands of disenfranchised

people, members of the clergy, and moral leaders will engage in protests and direct actions at statehouses and the U.S. Capitol. The leaders hope the six weeks of protest will be one of the largest waves of civil disobedience in the U.S. The actions will take place across at least 25 states (including California), as well as the District of Columbia. Its leaders hope that the weeks of action will lead to mass mobilization at the U.S. Capitol on June 21.

All this makes me think that the time is right for me to update and preach a sermon series that I offered several years ago on Sabbath Economics. This series will provide some theological underpinning of the Poor People's Campaign. So that's what I'm going to do this Lent (which starts on February 14; see article about Ash Wednesday on page 1).

I will also be joining the Poor People's Campaign more directly, for I feel I must join in calling our nation to a moral revival. I will attend a training this month at Zaytuna College in Berkeley, and I will be joining rallies and marches in Sacramento this spring. I will

probably join in some of the acts of civil disobedience and face arrest.

I hope you will join the Poor People's Campaign, too. If you are not already convinced that the

nation needs a moral revival, I hope my Lenten sermon series will convince you. Then I hope you will find ways to be involved, ways that are faithful to your circumstance and calling.

If you use email, I recommend going to the campaign's webpage at [poorpeoplescampaign.org](http://poorpeoplescampaign.org) and signing up to receive emails. If you do Facebook, I encourage you to "like" the Poor People's Campaign and California Poor People's Campaign pages and to check them regularly for inspiration and information.

I ask that you pray. Pray for me as I prepare my sermons. Pray for our church as we seek to faithfully fulfill our mission. Pray for the leadership of the Poor People's Campaign, and for all those involved in the Campaign, and pray for a moral revival in our nation.

## Moderator's Moment

As a church, we strive to be inclusive. The operative term here should be "strive", because as simple as it sounds, "being inclusive" is a rather complex thing. Take for example, our requirement for membership of the church. Our Bylaws state that "Any baptized person" can become a member and provides no pathway to membership for those who are not baptized. Pastor Jeff addressed this in his sermon on January 14. However, his sermon was left open-ended and he asked that we complete the sermon in our town hall meeting after the service.



I was quite moved by our town hall meeting, A lot of people shared their thoughts and provided much needed perspectives for the Cabinet to consider. This is what I gleaned from the conversations:

Anyone associated with the church has as much access to the church community as members of the church do – except for the ability to vote at congregational meetings and serving as an officer of the Cabinet.

Some feel that church leadership should be conducted by those who have professed their faith through baptism, while others point out that those baptized as infants, while technically baptized, did not profess any faith on their own.

Others stated that we are a Christian church that needs Christian leaders, which makes it important that members are Christian.

That begged the question, "How do you define a Christian?" which wasn't really answered during the meeting. It was also noted that some people do not have, or cannot find their Certificate of Baptism, and as such, we simply take their word for it.

This, and more, was discussed at the Cabinet meeting on January 15. While Cabinet agreed this is an important issue, we also believe that we don't have enough information to act on it. The Cabinet feels that we shouldn't rush into a decision; rather, we should pray on it and keep the discussing going.



**Interfaith Council’s Anti-Hate Statement**

As a grassroots collection of people from many spiritual traditions, we want to clearly state that our faith traditions call us to recognize all people as equal and sacred. We reject racism, bigotry, and hatred.

When expressions of white supremacy, anti-Semitism, neo-Nazi ideology, Islamophobia, hatred against ethnic minorities, and other forms of oppression make headlines,

we must stand firmly against these exhibitions of hate. The Nazi swastika, the Ku Klux Klan hood, and the Confederate flag are symbols that have no place in American society.

While we denounce violence in any form by any group, we reject suggestions of the moral equivalency of groups that promote white supremacy and hatred of all kinds with those who oppose such values and protest against them.

We praise the many groups that are working in our community and across our country to overcome division and build understanding, whether it is among people of different races, faiths, sexual orientations, gender identities, or gender expressions; between police officers and community members; or within our schools.

All our faiths are grounded in the common value of compassion. We affirm fair treatment for all and the centrality of “loving our neighbors as ourselves.” Prejudice, animosity, or violence against any group of people is completely antithetical to our religious principles. We promote our national values which declare that we are one nation with “liberty and justice for all.”

We call on all people of good will to work together for the common good and honor the contributions of all individuals. Rather than be divided by our differences, let us be enriched by our diversity.

### SECOND SATURDAY DOCUMENTARY FOCUSES ON FERGUSON UPRISING


*Whose Streets?* is an unflinching look at race relations and the 2014 Ferguson Missouri uprising. The film will be shown February 10 at 1:30 p.m. as part of the Second Saturday Documentary Series at Niles Discovery Church. The screening is free and open to the public.

Told by the activists and leaders who live and breathe the Black Lives Matter movement for justice, *Whose Streets?* is an unflinching look at the Ferguson uprising. When unarmed teenager, Michael Brown, is killed by police officer Darren Wilson, and left lying in the street for hours, it marks a breaking point for the residents of St. Louis, Missouri. Grief, long-standing racial tensions, and renewed anger bring residents together to hold vigils and protest this latest tragedy. Empowered parents, artists, and teachers from around the country come together as freedom fighters.

As the national guard descends on Ferguson with military grade weaponry, these young community members become the torchbearers of a new resistance. Filmmakers Sabaah Foleyan and Damon Davis know this story because they are part of the story.

There will be a moderated discussion after the screening.
