# LENTEN WORSHIP SERIES ASKS "WHAT R U UP 2?"

Get up to something instead of

giving something up this Lent.

The start of Lent is based on the date of Easter, and

Easter's date is based on the lunar calendar (the first Sunday after the first full moon after the northern hemisphere's spring equinox). This year, Easter will be on March 31. Lent starts 40 days earlier (not counting Sundays), which is February 14 this year.

The first day of Lent is called Ash Wednesday. It is our tradition to hold a special worship service on Ash Wednesday, often with neighboring churches. United Church of Christ Fremont will host this year's service, which you can read more about **below**.

We have a new worship series planned for Lent. Called

"What R U Up 2?" this series invites us to an unusual

practice for Lent. Many Christians give up something for Lent. Rather than giving something up, we'll get up to something. We will consider what Jesus is up to in the scriptures this season – and, instead of bemoaning what we can't do, or used to do, in a culture where "measuring up" to

external standards seems impossible, we will celebrate the small things we can do right now to respond to God's call in our place and time.

Come join us each week, online or on site, as we reflect on what we can be up to this Lent for the sake of Jesus.



#### United Church Of Christ Fremont To Host Ash Wednesday Service



A special worship service bringing together United Church of Christ Fremont and Niles Discovery Church will be held on Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2023, at 7:00 p.m., at the United Church of Christ Fremont, 38255 Blacow Rd.

The Rev. Charlene Hinkley reminds us, "Jesus spends time asking us what soil we are: rocky, thorny, eaten by birds or good." With that metaphor in mind, this Ash Wednesday/Valentine's Day, we begin our Lenten journey reflecting on our soil – the dirt and ashes, the stardust we all come from and return to.

"There are times when God is so close and so powerfully present, we just burst with love," Hinkley says. "There are times when we have stepped away from God and our faith, when we have stopped practicing and just let it slide away. There are times when everything about our faith seems wrong and we just turn away. We will plant some seeds, water our soil, and be marked with Ashes."

# A LETTER FROM NILES DISCOVERY CHURCH

At the Cabinet meeting on January 15, 2024 (the day we officially remember Martin Luther King, Jr.), the Cabinet agreed by consensus to send the letter reprinted below, to our elected national officials on behalf of the church calling for them to exert diplomatic pressure for immediate ceasefire, de-escalate actions, and respect international law.

Sent on 1/17/24

Dear President Biden, Senator Padilla, Senator Butler, Rep. Swalwell, and Rep. Khanna,

We are all still reeling from the reports of tragic loss of life and continued atrocities taking place in Israel and Gaza. There is a growing concern that the cycle of violence could escalate into a wider regional war if steps are not taken to deescalate this conflict. As we mourn, and as we pray for those who have lost loved ones and for those still seeking information on the well-being of friends and family who are hostages or imprisoned, we are compelled by our faith to call on you as our representatives to support a Just Peace in the region.

In this tense moment, we join with Christians and people of many faiths in calling for de-escalation and for restraint from measures that would only intensify the violence. As a member congregation of both the United Church of Christ and the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), we call on you as our elected leaders to increase the diplomatic pressure for an immediate ceasefire, for all parties to take steps toward de-escalation, and for all parties to respect international law to prevent further violence.

As a Just Peace Church, Niles Discovery Church knows that an end to the immediate acts of violence will not automatically bring justice. The international community must address the core systemic issues of the war and ongoing occupation of Palestinian territory if there is going to be any chance of building a positive peace. We continue our prayers for those impacted. And we know that peace *is* possible.

# FREE DOCUMENTARY FILMS CONTINUE IN FREMONT SPONSORED BY NDC!



Looking for serious films on important subjects? Great documentary films have been shown monthly in Fremont for the past 17 years! These free screenings have covered the topics of peace, justice, ecology, energy, politics, and more. Early on, they were shown at the Alameda County Fremont Library but after a few years, due to logistics problems, moved to Niles Congregational Church and then to our new Niles Discovery Church. When COVID-19 raised its ugly presence, the series switched from in-person to Zoom, using the modern capabilities at Niles Discovery Church, allowing anyone in the US to join in. The current plan is to move to a hybrid Zoom/in-person dual system in early 2024. An important part of the series is a post-screening discussion session where all viewers have an opportunity to express their ideas, led by a unique discussion leader who has some background in the topic of the month.

The program began in 2006 as Tri-City Perspectives led by experienced Bay Area activists (and film connoisseurs) Jane Bark, Dr. Paul Rea and Tom Ford, with Dr. Sharat Lin being the first Discussion Leader. Dr. Lin was closely affiliated with the San Jose Peace and Justice Center. The first films shown at the Fremont Library were *Iraq For*

Sale and An Inconvenient Truth, so the series got off to a good start. When the series moved to Niles, our own Rev. Jeff Spencer became the prime mover. The series was then renamed the Second Saturday Documentary Series, which as the name suggest meets the second Saturday of the month, at 1:30 pm. Second Saturday Documentary Series is now sponsored by Niles Discovery Church and, more informally, the San Jose Peace and Justice Center.

Since the beginning in 2006, Second Saturday Documentary Series has shown well over 100 free films. In the past couple of years, topics and films (some of which belong in multiple topics) include:
