## CONFIRMATION CLASS BEGINS OCTOBER 24 ADDITIONAL STUDENTS WELCOME

Every so often, Pastor Jeff offers a Confirmation Class to people 8th grade and above (adults are welcome to take the class, too.). The purpose of the class is to give the students what they need (information, experience, and time of reflection) to choose whether or not this is the time in their lives to confirm their identity as Christians.

Each student has their own, unique story about their spiritual journey. For some students, a Christian identity was claimed on their behalf by their parents when they were baptized as infants. These students may use the class to help them decide if they want to claim that identity as their own now that they are maturing into adulthood. Some students come from families that are new to church and they use the class to



learn more about Christianity and if it's right for them. For other students, this is a time to discern if they want to claim a Christian identity through the sacrament of baptism. Those who choose to confirm their identity as Christians do so through the rite of Confirmation.

The class begins on October 24. It will meet most Sundays at 2:00 p.m. through May of 2022. It will include a few movie nights, some special worship services, a half-dozen or so meetings with a mentor, and a couple field trips during the year. Confirmands (that's the fancy church word for Confirmation Class students) will also have assigned spiritual practices to explore between classes and some reading assignments.

If you would like to join the class, please let Pastor Jeff know right away.

## A FUTURE WITH HOPE FALL PLEDGE CAMPAIGN LAUNCHES THIS MONTH

Many people have experienced this time of pandemic as a kind of exile, and so this year's pledge campaign turns to the Prophet Jeremiah, who preached about a future with hope in the midst of exile, for our inspiration.

Experiences of separation are at least as old as the ancient stories of the Garden of Eden, the Israelites' exile in Babylon, and the parable of the Prodigal Son. And yet, those stories of separation include the seeds of hope, for they all end with some sort of return, some sort of reunion. In fact, that hope is central to the Christian story: Jesus and his followers were separated by betrayal and death, and then reunited by forgiveness and newness of life. Even on our most "normal" days (whatever those are), our lives are a rhythm of gathering and dispersing, coming together and going apart, calls to worship and benedictions.



Here's what to expect. You'll be receiving three letters, beginning in mid-October inviting your reflection. Beginning on October 24, our worship services will focus on our theme, "A Future with Hope," and will include interviews with members of our congregation. Pledge Sunday, the day we dedicate our pledges of financial support of the ministries of our church, is November 14 (pledge forms and instructions will be included in the third letter mentioned above).

Amid the uncertainty we are feeling as the pandemic continues, let us build a future with hope.

## INTRODUCING MICHAEL MORALES OUR NEW INTERIM MUSIC DIRECTOR

After an extensive search, the Personnel Committee selected Michael Morales to serve as our Interim Music Director. He will be focusing on selecting our worship music and finding or creating audio and video for us to use in worship (with appropriate permissions). When the choir can safely rehearse in-person, he will help get it going again.

Michael is a countertenor and conductor with Bachelor's degrees in Drama (UC Irvine) and Music (Sonoma State University), and a Master's in Conducting from Eastern Illinois University.

He has led ensembles and classes throughout the Bay Area, including Town Hall Theatre in Lafayette, Chanticleer's LAB Skills workshops, and Cantare Children's Choirs of Oakland. Most recently, he was named Artistic Director for Singers



Marin. Previously, he served as the Worship and Music Assistant at Lafayette-Orinda Presbyterian Church, Music Director for Eden United Church of Christ, and Music Teacher at Our Lady of Guadalupe and St. Edward schools. As a vocal soloist, Michael can be heard on the Pacific Mozart Ensemble album "Dave Brubeck and American Poets." Other notable performances include the alto in Bernstein's *Chichester Psalms* at Weill Hall, and the *Abbey Road* medley with Sonoma State University's Rock Collegium. He also sings as part of UC Irvine's alumni men's ensemble, Men in Blaque.

Apart from choral and art music, Michael is a fervent Beatles scholar, an avid Giants fan, and enjoys exploring every tap house in the Bay Area with his wife, Katie.

## TWO COMMUNITIES – ONE PURPOSE

Did you know? Around five years ago Niles Discovery Church began helping to support the St. James Community Orphanage School – a primary school of around 100 children in classes from kindergarten to 5<sup>th</sup> grade. Most of these children would be without formal education if it weren't for the school and were not able to have lunch. Located on the Mfangano Island of Lake Victoria, in Kenya, the community is sustained by a fishery industry. The tribes of the island are primarily Suba and Luo, and they have inhabited the island for two hundred years, fishing and doing sustainable agriculture. The school has had ups and downs, especially with the pandemic and economic challenges. Despite this, the down-sized school resumed classes in July for grades Kindergarten through 4<sup>th</sup> grade. This has been possible due to the generous support of our church community as well as other supporters. The six-month cost for the school is \$4,200, and the Ministry of Social Concerns hopes to keep the school going. A local Seventh Day Adventist church is raising funds in support of the school as well.

In November Rich Godfrey hopes to give a short presentation of how things are progressing with the school, and how we might share our own blessings with these children in Kenya. Two communities – one purpose!

The second part of the offering will go to the United Church of Christ's [Neighbors In Need Offering](#). 
## LET'S MAKE MONEY




# FELLOWSHIP NEWS

## HOW TO SPOT A MALICIOUS EMAIL

We do the best we can to keep our email system as secure as possible. Nonetheless, spoofing (when someone makes an email look like it came from someone at church) and hacking (when someone actually gets into an email account) are possible. Here are some things to keep in mind about legitimate emails from your church staff.



- ↳ It will always have a subject that means something to you
- ↳ It will always have information in the body of the email describing purpose, not just a "Hey, check this out."
- ↳ It will always be from an @nilesdiscoverychurch.org email address.
- ↳ It will always have the name and other info about the person sending message.
- ↳ It will never ask you for money for a church staff member.

When in doubt, don't click on a link in an email and don't open any attachments. You can always send an email (not a reply, but a new email) to the person who (supposedly) sent the email, asking if it's legit.




