## Advent Begins on November 29

I believe in the sun, even when it's not shining
I believe in love, even when feeling it not
I believe in God, even when [God] is silent

These poignant words, written by an anonymous Jewish poet during the Holocaust and set to music by


the composer Mark Miller (who also composed our familiar "Let's Walk Together" song), form the musical foundation for our Advent worship series this year, "I Believe Even When ... Fill the Night with Music and Light." Each week, we'll sing a verse of "I Believe" and light one of the Advent candles of Hope, Love, Joy, and Peace. Each week, we'll hear the

story of a "Carol of Resistance," a traditional holiday song that has a deeper message behind it of hope over despair and resistance to oppression. Even though we can't be present together in person, we'll see images of our sanctuary, beautifully decorated for Advent and lit up with candlelight. Even though the choir can't gather to sing together, we'll hear their voices in a "virtual choir" during our worship services. Even though we can't light the Advent wreath together

in person, we'll be lighting our own wreaths at home, together in worship.

Although we can't be together in person, our Zoom worship throughout the season will be filled with candlelight and special music. We can believe that God is present, that Jesus will be born, even when our lives are difficult, and our hearts are breaking. We hope you'll join us throughout the season for

these special services, filled with light and hope.

Then everyone will be split into randomly assigned groups for a holiday craft project. Finally, we will return together to have a Christmas Carol Sing-along.

## START RECOMMENDS, CABINET AGREES NO IN-PERSON WORSHIP DURING 2021 FIRST QUARTER



The Strategic Taskforce to Assess Returning Team (START) recommended that the church not have in-person worship services during the first quarter (January through March) of

2021. At their November meeting, the Cabinet agreed.

START anticipates a tightening of restrictions in

Alameda County and recirculation of inside air, a reality given the design of the church's heating and cooling systems, remains potentially dangerous.

START continues to monitor the County's and State's restrictions and the best science available in making these recommendations. They will be making a recommendation for the second quarter of 2021 at the February Cabinet meeting.

## Longest Night Services A service of Light in the Midst of Darkness

For many, Christmas time is a bittersweet time of year. For people who are dealing with grief, significant life

changes, sobriety, family dysfunction, and other challenges, this time of year can be especially difficult.

"This is also the time of year with the longest nights," Pastor Jeff noted, "so on the longest night of the year our congregation offers a special meditative

worship service that makes time for remembering, sharing our hurting places with God, and preparing our hearts for the coming of Christ."

Because of the pandemic, this service is moving online this year; register at <u>bit.ly/longnite2020</u>. Traditionally, this service has been very interactive, with people coming forward to light candles in quiet. While trying to keep the service interactive, modifications have had to

be made for the online environment.

"I'm hoping people will create a worship space at home by their computers," Pastor Jeff explained. "Ideally, people will have a central candle (wax or electric) that we will light at the beginning of the service. In addition, I hope they have seven additional candles or seven stones (they don't

have to be big) nearby to gather around that central candle as the service progresses."

"Even though we can't gather in person, I hope this service will provide a space for people to release their anger, face their emptiness, have a good cry (if that's what they need), and know that God cares."

### RECEPTION OF NEW MEMBERS

We will be receiving new members during one of our regular Zoom worship services in January (date TBA). If you have been considering membership at Niles Discovery Church, please contact Pastor Jeff or Pastor Brenda so we can include you in our plans.

## TWO ONLINE SERVICES PLANNED FOR CHRISTMAS EVE

"Everything is topsy turvy this year anyway," Pastor Jeff explained, "so we're going to try a new schedule for Christmas Eve. Will do our best to keep other element of the service as familiar as possible."

Our Pastors, with the support of the Ministry of Spiritual Life Team, are planning two worship services for Christmas Eve, one at 8:00 p.m. and the other at 11:30 p.m.

The 8:00 service will be "modeled after the late Christmas Eve services we've celebrated in the past," Pastor Jeff said. Of course, it will be online, so modifications will have to be made. The service will start with a re-lighting of the Advent wreath. It will move into a liturgy of lessons and carols telling the Christmas story; members of our church are

recording Christmas carols that we'll be invited to sing along with at home. Pastor Jeff will offer a

sermon. We will celebrate communion.
And the service will close with candle lighting.

To prepare for this service, people should gather their

Advent wreath (if they have one) to light at the beginning of the service, some food and beverage for communion, and a Christ candle – wax or battery-powered – for the candle lighting at the end of the service. "From a safety point of view, I have no problem with

battery powered candles," Pastor Jeff said.

The 11:30 service will be much

simpler. It will include lessons and carols telling the Christmas story and the lighting of candles. Having an Advent wreath and a Christ candle available is encouraged. This service will last about half an hour.



## 1957 Morphs Into 2020 At The Parsonage

It is the Ministry of Property Team's responsibility to care for and manage the integrity of the property. As with all the homes in this area, it has appreciated in value. Through the years, the house has acquired a new roof, double-paned windows, and had some other small renovations. 2020 was the year for a major overhaul. This year the house went green.

It all began with a gift from a member to install solar panels on the roof and turned into a major project involving solar, electrical, plumbing, mechanical contractors, and a lot of work by the Ministry of Property Team to comply with permit applications and

inspections. Our Ministry of Property Team got "down and dirty" helping provide zero-cost manual labor to help stay within budget and the project could not have been completed without them. Even with the COVID-19 situation complicating everything, the house now has a new 200-amp panel, copper pipes replacing the old galvanized ones, solar panels, an electric heat pump providing heating and cooling, corrected waste lines, new heating ducts, and an EV charger in the garage.

The 2020 greening of this home was handled by the Ministry of Property Team with brains, dedication, and faithfulness. Special thanks to John Smith and Bill Palleschi for interacting with contractors and workers; thanks to Jeff for handling all the disruptions with good grace; and our parsonage would not have morphed into a 2020 example of a "green-house" without the hands and heart of Mark Twist.

## CAN YOU COUNT TO 1 TRILLION?

The Green Team is embarking on an exciting project to combat Global Warming and Climate Change. We are inviting our congregation to participate in the One Trillion Trees Initiative.

We are moving forward on several fronts to be able to contribute to the planting of One Trillion Trees World-Wide. The developing plan includes "acting local" by supporting Lynn Miller's commitment to TUFA (Tri-City Urban Forrest Alliance), planting hundreds of trees locally, urging the City of Fremont to accept and implement Dense Urban Forests of native trees, and joining the US chapter (us.1t.org) of the international Trillion Trees Community.

The first project is fun. Lynn has acorns from many species of oak trees and is offering "Acorn Planting Kits," to the congregation. Right now, she has enough for 11 kits. Beyond the Green Team's commitment, the plan is to propose to the Cabinet that the church join in these efforts by volunteering and providing financial support.

## Your Cans And Bottles Support A Girl In Jamaica, Too

Your redeemable cans and bottles, through the hard work of Ministry of Social Concerns Team member Rich Gallegos, enable Niles Discovery Church to support a boy in El Salvador and, more recently, a girl at Pringle School in Jamaica.

Pringle School is a residential home for girls in the hills of Carron Hall, St. Mary's, Jamaica and is operated by the United Church of Christ in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands. Our sponsorship is through the Child and Elder Sponsorship program administered by Global Ministries, a joint mission of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and the United Church of Christ.

Pringle Home is a safe haven for girls who have been abandoned or emotionally, sexually, or physically abused. They provide services to these girls including school, employment training, recreation, life skills, behavioral management, conflict resolution training, and devotions.

Counseling is provided to willing family members as girls prepare to leave the home, and enabling the girls to return home and contribute to their communities. The girls are referred to Pringle Home by the Jamaican government's Child Development Agency.
