CALL TO ANNUAL MEETING



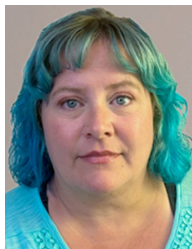

There’s a reason I was asked to help launch a local “Climate Hope Affiliate,” and I think it has to do with our Green Team. Our Green Team has shown excellent involvement locally and it’s been noticed by the national settings of the United Church of Christ. No wonder we’ve been asked to help create one of the first four CHAs. The purpose of the Climate Hope Affiliates program is to empower people of faith and conscience to address the interconnected crises of climate change and societal injustice. For us, this work is a calling.

If you want to learn more, I would love for you to come to the Affiliate Launch Workshop on Saturday, May 3, from 1:00 p.m. to 3:30 p.m., to see if this excites you as much as it does me. We’ll meet on-site at Niles Discovery Church.

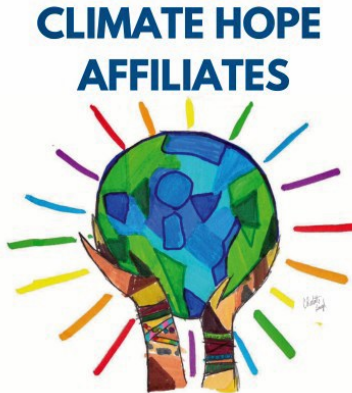
The Environmental Justice Ministry of the United Church of Christ is providing the training and support to start these powerful local groups (Climate Hope Affiliates) around the country to help accelerate action on the crises faced – where the climate crisis intersects with other crises of social justice. The director of the

Climate Hope Affiliates program, the Rev. Brooks Berndt, will come to Fremont and show the inspiring ways we can make a difference, provide a snapshot of the exciting support CHAs will provide, and explain what it will take to launch an affiliate.

Our goal is to equip members to become champions for a livable world. We will learn how we can do that by encouraging our elected officials, the media, and others in the community (leaders and regular folk) to provide the leadership we need to address the crises we face. We will even take basic action, with some coaching, at the launch workshop: writing to our Congressional Representatives and Senators.

I hope you will attend this workshop for what you’ll gain from the 2½-hour investment and to help you decide if you want to be part of our local Climate Hope Affiliate.

While reading the news can leave me discouraged about climate change and more (much more), my conversation with the CHA inviting team has left me feeling really excited about the difference we can make, especially with the approach CHAs use, and I think you will feel the same way.

YTD SUMMARY OF NDC FINANCES

Reserve Investment Funds Balances

1/1/25	\$892,254
3/31/25	\$885,784

Through the first quarter of 2025, income exceeded budget and expenses were less than budgeted, resulting in a surplus rather than a projected budget deficit. Income is up with pledges, loose offering, and facilities use all exceeding budget. Facilities use includes approximately \$8,000 from PG&E. This is their final payment as the project has been completed. Expenses are down slightly across most budget categories. The reserve fund balance has decreased slightly due to market performance. January was up but both February and particularly March were down. The Finance Committee expects continued market volatility in the short to medium term. As a reminder, past performance is not an indicator or guarantee of future results.

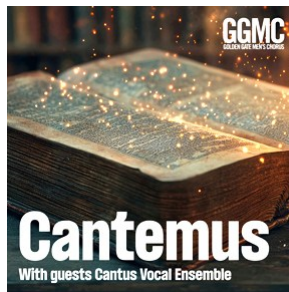
