ENGAGE IN DREAMING GOD'S DREAM

The call to be disciples of Jesus is a call to be part of Jesus' team that is building "the beloved community,"

to use Martin Luther King, Jr.'s term. The first step in that building process is taking hold of the vision. That's why we will be *Dreaming God's Dream* during this fall's pledge campaign.

If you read the gospels, you won't find the phrase "God's beloved community," but you will find "the kingdom of God" (or

"the kingdom of heaven"). That's because the first authorized translation of the Bible into English was done when James was king (James the VI if you were Scottish; James I if you were English). That's why that authorized translation is called "the King James Bible."

When the political system you know is a monarchy and only men are monarchs, you translate the Greek work

for "empire" (as in the Roman Empire) as "kingdom." However, I think God's dream for us and creation is not so much a "kingdom" headed up by a divine monarch as it is a "beloved community" of justice, freedom, and enough.

From October 12 to November 2, we will explore those three aspects of the

"beloved community" God invites us to imagine and build. We will use Bryan Sirchio's "Dream God's Dream" as our theme song. Come dream with me.

To transform Room 1 into a "green room" for Flamy, we need a portable full-length mirror and a table-top mirror, along with some healthful snacks. If you can contribute to any of these, please let me know.

On the day of the concert, we will need volunteers to load in equipment and merchandise at 3:30 p.m., volunteers to set-up the merchandise table (at 5:00 p.m.) and to staff the merchandise table before the concert (6:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.) and after the concert during the reception. We also need volunteers to run the box office, volunteers to usher, volunteers to staff the kitchen during the post-concert reception, and volunteers to clean-up after the reception. Flamy's 2022 debut record, *Bible Belt Baby*, reached the #1 spot on the iTunes Christian Chart (the first drag performer to achieve this feat), was nominated for Best Pop Album at the San Diego Music Awards, and was named one of the Top Ten Queer Country Albums of 2023 by Rainbow Rodeo Magazine. Her single "Good Day" debuted at #20 on the Billboard Christian digital sales chart.

How To Spot A Malicious Email

We do the best we can to keep our email system as secure as possible. Nonetheless, spoofing (when someone makes an email look like it came from someone at church) and hacking (when someone actually gets into an email account) are possible. Here are some things to keep in mind about legitimate emails from your church staff.

- It will always have a subject that means something to you
- It will always have information in the body of the email describing purpose, not just a "Hey, check this out."
- It will always be from an @nilesdiscoverychurch.org email address.
- It will always have the name and other info about the person sending message in the message.
- It will never ask you for money for a church staff member.

When in doubt, don't click on a link in an email and don't open any attachments. You can always send an email (not a reply, but a new email) to the person who (supposedly) sent the email, asking if it's legit.


