


I recently noticed that many of the lectionary readings (readings assigned for Sundays on a three-year rotation) in January and February are about light. I wonder if that is because, in the Northern hemisphere, the days are getting longer and lighter, but there is still more night than day.



Darkness can affect us emotionally and spiritually. That's why I picked Spiritual Self Care as a theme for five Sundays, starting January 11. I hope you will find this worship series nurturing.

CABINET FORWARDS "DECLARATION" TO CONGREGATION FOR ADOPTION

After two months of discussion, draft versions, and refinement, the Cabinet finalized, and is recommending to the congregation for adoption, a declaration titled, "Raising Our Voices in Protest and Witness." The declaration will be presented to the congregation for potential amendment and a vote on adopting it at the Financial Annual Meeting of the congregation on Sunday, February 1, 2026, that will immediately follows the worship service.

Raising Our Voices in Protest and Witness:

A Niles Discovery Church Declaration Fremont, California

We, the people of Niles Discovery Church, will not remain silent. We are called by our humanity, by our faith, and by the God in whom we place our faith to raise our voices in protest and witness, proclaiming that our values stand in direct contrast to those of the current administration. We denounce as immoral the growing authoritarian forces within our government that are now ignoring the rule of law and imposing regressive and racist policies on American society.


We are followers of Jesus who take to heart the values presented in the Bible as we know it: Blessed and loved are the poor, the poor in spirit, the bereft, the meek, those who hunger for food or for righteousness, the merciful, the pure in heart, the peacemakers, and the persecuted. We cannot, therefore, be reserved in our witness to God's word, living as we do in a world that values wealth, profits from war, and persecutes dissent. Our calling is not to be silent but to be like a city built upon a hill, to be the salt of the earth, to be the light of the world.

Christians have sometimes failed as individuals and communally as churches and denominations, offering silence when protest and witness was needed, as in the failure to protest slavery, the genocide of Indigenous Americans, and the incarceration of Japanese Americans during World War II. We do not want to fail in this moment.

RAISING OUR VOICES IN PROTEST AND WITNESS

We cannot, in good faith, abide a government that mistreats migrants or anyone else in need of shelter, nurture, and spiritual fellowship, or a president (or any other politician) who lies habitually or who attacks journalists, scholars, scientists, attorneys, and activists seeking to tell the truth.

Niles Discovery Church members and friends will not remain silent. We choose to help bring about God's joyful actions of peace, justice, hope, and love. We will support policies that are



Appendix A: Examples of blatant overreach of the current administration

- Militarized takeovers of American cities,
- Attempts to end constitutional guarantees to birthright and naturalized citizenship,
- Rollbacks of civil rights protections for women, ethnic minorities, and LGBTQ+ people,
- Terrorizing immigrant communities through kidnapping, imprisonment without due process, family separation, and deportation to facilities known to engage in deprivation and torture,
- Imperiling efforts to halt climate change, which threatens the health of all Creation and humanity, and is already ravaging the most vulnerable among us,
- Slashing science funding and halting progress on scientific research essential to solving pressing societal problems,
- Criminalizing protest (particularly protest of genocide in Gaza) and escalating attacks on the press and academic freedom,
- Gutting of essential government services, including those that feed the poor and provide healthcare for the uninsured, both at home and abroad,
- Executive overreach that undermines checks and balances, and dismantles democratic institutions.
- Ignoring International Law, as in attacking Venezuelan "drug boats" on the high seas.

Appendix B: Examples of actions that support our traditions and beliefs

- To speak up as individuals and as a congregation, for we aspire to speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves (Proverbs 31:8-9).
- To support our pastors and preachers as they proclaim our values from the pulpit, and when they fail, to encourage them to speak up.
- To be unwavering in our support for immigrants, for we aspire to love the stranger (Leviticus 19:33-34).
- To help dismantle structural racism, for we aspire to obey the laws of God rather than human laws (Acts 5:29).
- To help weave our LGBTQ+ spiritual kin into the fabric of society, for we are all one in Jesus Christ (Galatians 3:28).
- To remember and learn not to repeat the ways in which our country has failed in righteousness and acted with cruelty.
- To stand in solidarity with our spiritual kin of every faith and no faith, especially those under threat, for we understand that everyone who does God's will is acceptable to God (Acts 10:34-35).
- To help preserve the Earth, with particular emphasis on the urgent need to address climate change, for we aspire to be responsible stewards and to care for creation (Genesis 2:15).

"ASK A TRANS" TOWNHALL COMES TO CHURCH

Jenna Daugherty, a lifelong Fremont resident and passionate trans advocate, has worked hard to increase the understanding and appreciation of the humanity in all people, especially those on the gender identity spectrum. Her advocacy is the primary focus of the "Ask a Trans Townhall" on Saturday, January 10, at 6:00 p.m., in the sanctuary of Niles Discovery Church.

Homeschooled by fundamentalist Christians, Jenna left that religion behind while holding onto the proactive activism that her parents modeled for her. She applies this activism to her secular advocacy. Her knowledge of the Christian culture is also why she tries to humanize trans and nonbinary people within the Christian community. She hopes her efforts will help everyone gain a better understanding of the struggles faced by trans people. This is why she is holding the Townhall and hopes you will come with your questions.



8 CABINET ADOPTS SPECIAL OFFERING SCHEDULE FOR 2026

At their meeting on December 15, the church's Cabinet adopted the following schedule of special offerings for 2026.

- January: <u>Tri-City Volunteers</u> (supports the food bank in our area)
- February: St. James School (an elementary school in Kenya on Lake Victoria, primarily for orphaned children, with which Niles Discovery Church has had an informal connection for about a decade)
- March: One Great Hour of <u>Sharing/Week of Compassion</u> (denominational development and disaster response; split 50/50)
- April: Educational offering, split between <u>Pacific School of</u> <u>Religion</u> (the local seminar for training pastors in both of our denominations) and the <u>Disciples Seminary Foundation</u> (the DOC organization supporting people seeking

ordination).

- May: <u>SAVE</u> Safe Alternatives to Violent Environments
- June: Pentecost/Strengthen the Church (denominational evangelism offerings; split 50/50)
- July: School Supplies (in addition to the special offering, supplies are gathered all month; distributed to those in need through the <u>Fremont</u> Family Resource Center)
- August: Pastors' Discretionary Fund (use by our pastors to assist church members and neighbors who are in financial crisis)
- September: <u>Heifer</u>
 <u>International</u> (kids in our church decide later in the year what animals to "buy")
- October: <u>Reconciliation/</u> <u>Neighbors In Need/</u>Making Amends Fund¹ (racial justicerelated offerings of the

Disciples of Christ, the United Church of Christ, and Niles Discovery Church)

- November: The focus of this offering is chosen by the Ministry of Social Concern Team. Their current plan is for the offering to support the ministries of Puente de la Costa Sur.
- December: Homelessness
 Ministries of Niles Discovery
 Church (used by the church's
 Homelessness Task Force for
 homelessness ministries they
 coordinate)
- ¹ Recognizing that our church is founded from the legacy European colonizers, Niles Discovery Church has established a "Making Amends Fund," dedicated to the church's wider work of making amends to the Indigenous People of the area now called "Fremont" and "the Tri-Cities." This is new work and more will be published on the website about this effort as it develops.

January's special offering is for the Tri-City Volunteers. Tri-City Volunteers runs the largest client-direct food



bank in southern Alameda County. Each month, this agency provides emergency grocery assistance to almost 6,000 families and serves up to 16,000 individuals through their marketplace and bag lunch programs. Tri-City Volunteers began in 1970—started by Mary Hewitt and Grace Draper, members of our predecessor congregations. It has grown from the work of community members that believe in the need for food security in the Tri-City area.
