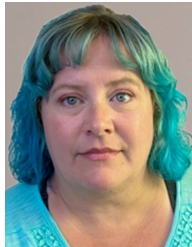

## AUGUST 30 WORSHIP SERVICE WILL BE ON ZOOM ONLY

Each year, our participation in the Niles neighborhood flea market and antiques fair brings in a substantial amount of money while offering great bargains to our neighbors and heart-felt fellowship to the people who prepare for the big weekend and who work those days. Of course, our participation in the flea market weekend also gets in the way of our typical gathering for worship. In years past, we've held an online only worship service at our usual time in the midst of the flea market. For the past two years, we have held an on-Zoom-only service on the Sunday evening of Flea Market weekend. It has worked so well, we're going to do it again.

10 miles up Lake Chelan and 15 miles beyond that, up a winding dirt road into the North Cascades Mountains in Washington State, there's a Lutheran retreat center called Holden Village. At one level, it is an abandoned copper mining village. At another level, at least for

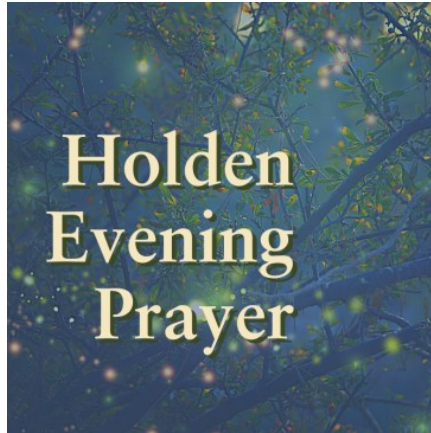
people like me, it is holy ground. One of the practices at Holden Village is to have a vespers service each evening.

Vespers is a simple and old prayer liturgy of the Christian church.

A little over three decades ago, one of my favorite contemporary hymn writers, Marty Haugen, took this simple prayer service and set it to music, calling it *Holden Evening Prayer*. It has become a tradition to sing this setting of the service once a week (I forget if it's Friday or Saturday night) at Holden Village.

On Sunday, August 30, at 7:30 p.m., after the flea market is over, clean up

is done, and people are feeling tired, we're going to have a simple Vespers service on Zoom (so people don't have to get back in the car and come back to the church) using *Holden Evening Prayer*. Through the second quarter of 2026, income exceeded budget and expenses were less, resulting in a small surplus rather than a projected budget deficit. Income is up with pledges, loose offering, and facilities-use all exceeding budget. Expenses are down slightly across most budget categories, including staffing.

## HOW ARE OUR FINANCES?



Income exceeded expenses for the first part of the year, resulting in over a \$10,000 surplus. In two of the last three months, expenses have exceeded income, resulting in the small YTD surplus. If this trend continues, we will be moving into a deficit budget and will have to withdraw more from cash reserves to cover expenses. This is what we anticipated when we passed the budget at the beginning of the year with a significant deficit. While we are in much better shape than the budget projected, we are trending towards a deficit.

The reserve fund balance has increased YTD but has fluctuated significantly from month to month due to market forces. The Finance Committee expects continued market volatility in the short to medium term. As a reminder, past performance is

not an indicator or guarantee of future results.

## TWO JOIN CARE TEAM

The bylaws of our church state that one of the Standing Committees of our congregation is the Care Team. "The Care Team is appointed by and works with the Pastor to extend the pastoral care of the church and to promote the health of the whole person, integrating spiritual and physical health."

Care Team members complete a 20-hour training program and continue to learn and reflect together to empower their ministry and to promote their health as whole people, integrating spiritual, emotional, and physical health. Beth and Cindy join Val Parker (our Faith Community Nurse) and Pastor Jeff as Care Team members.

# BEWARE! SCAMMERS ARE GETTING MORE SOPHISTICATED

It is so frustrating, but there's nothing we can do at this end to stop it. Criminals are creating fake Gmail accounts to make it look like the emails they send are coming from me ... and they're not! You'll notice in the picture that they've even taken my photo and added it to the Gmail account they create just to make it look like the email is coming from me.

It appears that our church directory has been scraped for email addresses. Now your email address is out there and associated with me as your pastor. The only defense is for you to be aware of the scam they run and take precautions.

## How the scam typically works:

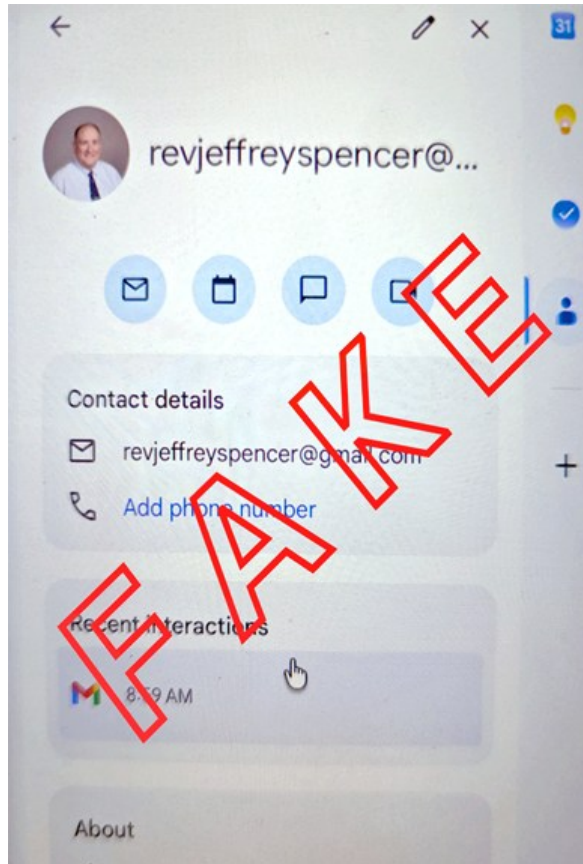
The scammers create a Gmail account that looks like it could be mine.

Then they send a politely worded but a little vague message to each email address they've scraped from the church directory, asking you to help with a concern that the fake Pastor Jeff has. They almost always ask for you to reply by email (not with a phone call). That's red-flag #1.

You think the email is from me, so you reply with some version of a "How can I help?" because you think the email is from me.

They send back an email saying something about "me" wanting to help an unnamed person out of some sort of jam, asking you to somehow send money. The typical ask is for you to buy some gift cards and to photograph the card numbers and security codes and email that back.

Well, you already think the emails are from me, and because you trust me, you think the ask is legitimate, and you do so. They get the info and cash out the cards.



They've stolen money from you. All without me knowing anything about what happened.

On one hand, the fact that you were targeted is a compliment. It says that they think the trust we have in real life is deep enough that they can take advantage of it. And their violation of that trust is what really stings.

## What you can do:

Keep an eye out for signs that an email might be a scam. Remember that legitimate emails from me or anyone on the church staff ...

... won't have a vague subject line.

... will always have information in the body of the email describing its purpose. It won't

say, "Hey, check this out," without also explaining *why* you should check it out. It won't ask for a favor without explaining what the favor is up front.

... will always be from an @nilesdiscoverychurch.org email address (note: scammers have become more sophisticated and could possibly spoof this, so this test alone is not always enough).

... will always have the name and other info about the person sending message in the message.

... will *never* lead to asking you for money (or gift cards or wire transfers, etc.). I have a Pastor's Discretionary Fund to meet emergency needs, and we have an annual Special Offering to make sure that fund has money.

... won't ever ask you to limit communications to email.

When in doubt, don't reply, don't click on a link in an email, and don't open any attachments. Instead, call the person who appears to be sending the email and ask if it's legit.

## ABOUT PRIDE PLACE OF BELONGING

Pride Place of Belonging was formed at Niles Discovery Church to support the LGBTQIA+ community, recognizing that there was no other location designated for the Queer Community in Fremont. Since Niles Discovery Church has been an Open and Affirming Congregation for over 30 years, we decided we are capable of creating a safe, supportive, and fun place for queer people to gather a couple times a month.

**What to donate:** small working appliances, kitchen tools, dishes, glassware (not chipped), pots and pans (with coating intact), small moveable furniture, linens with no stains or tears, decorative items, clocks, jewelry, collectibles, art, toys, unused pet supplies, small rugs, purses, hats, accessories, general interest books, holiday decor, lamps, bikes, scooters, working electronics, TVs and radios with their cords attached, and so on!

**Items we cannot accept:** baby furniture, kitchen knives, upholstered furniture, old microwaves, heavy sports equipment, clothing or shoes, broken objects, curtain rods, broken tools, textbooks, dictionaries, encyclopedias or manuals, plumbing fixtures, construction items, lighting fixtures, sofas, mattresses/bed pillows, random cords, or TV parts.

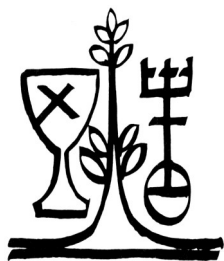
